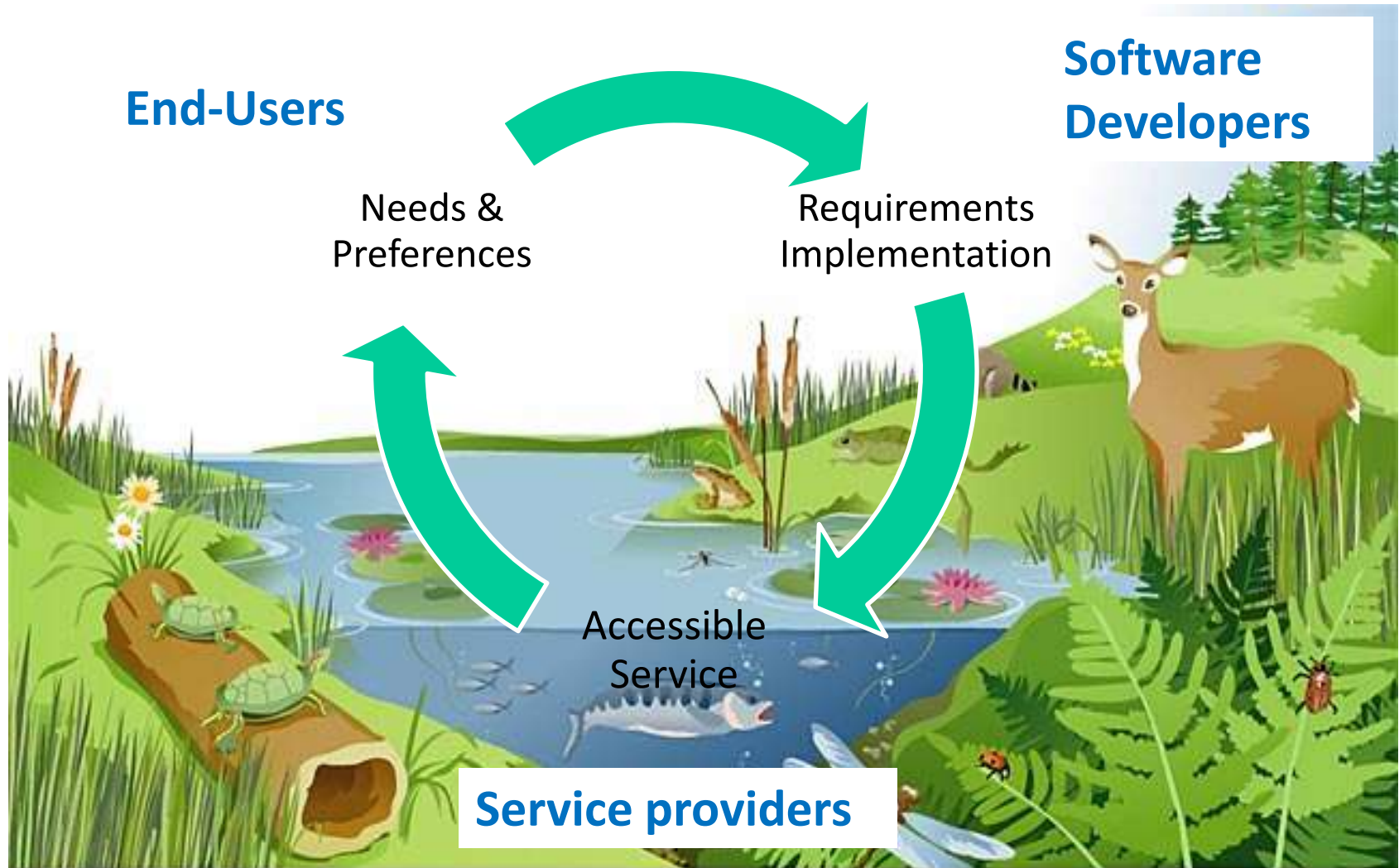

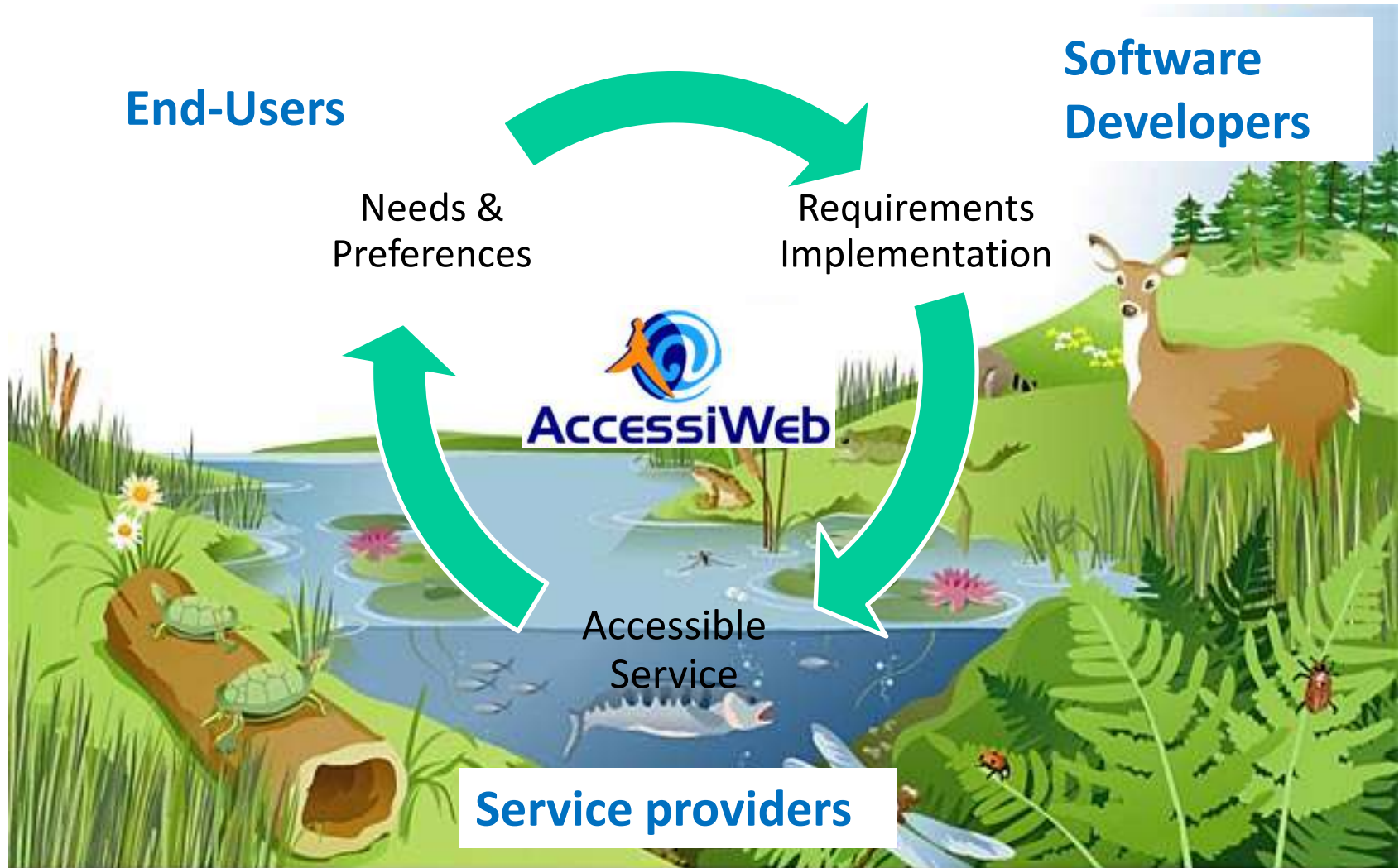

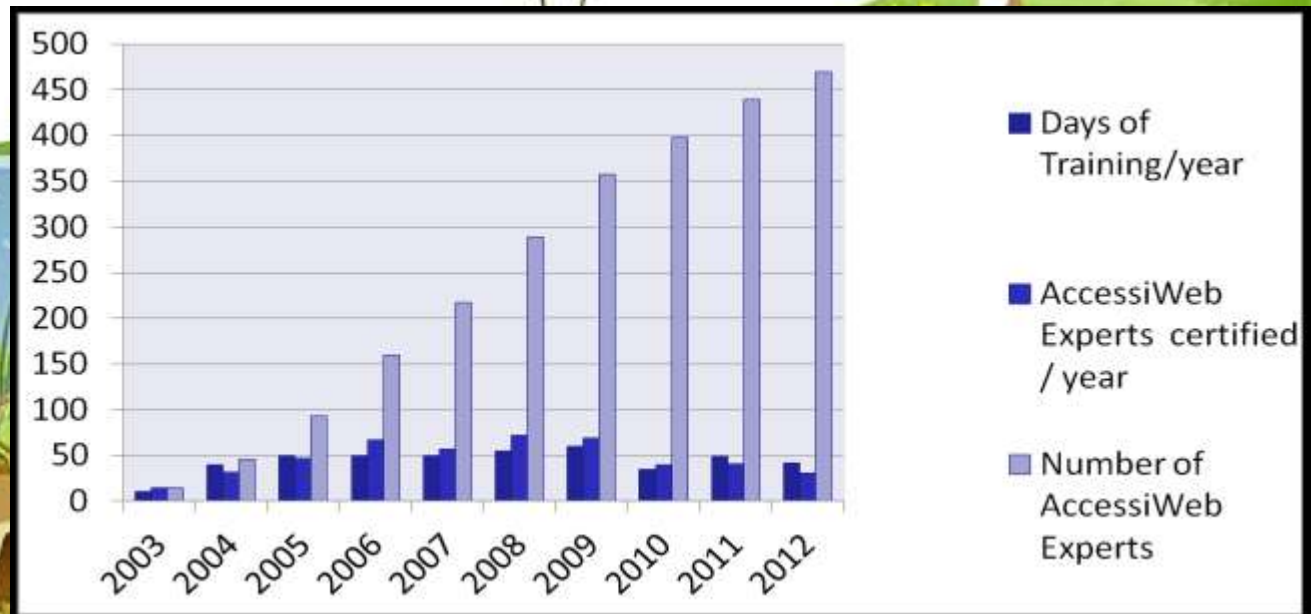

## AccessiWeb Working Group (GTA)

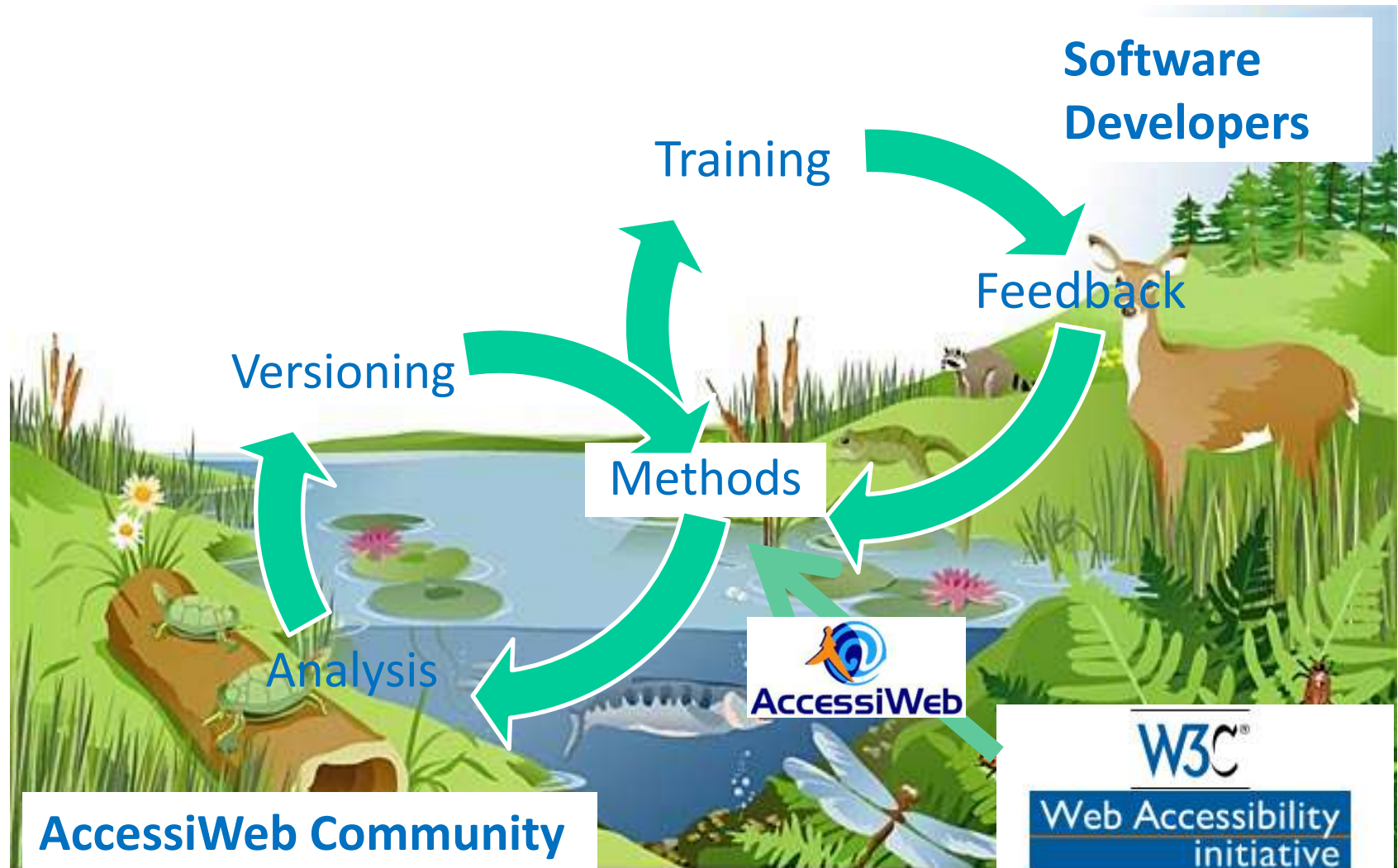
- Liaison with W3C/WAI (BrailleNet membership)
